

Rev. Woodhouse's Illness Saddens Ionia and Lyons

Below is a likeness of Rev. W. T. Woodhouse, pastor of the Baptist church of Ionia, who has been ill for the past few months from a stroke of paralysis. He is one of the city's popular ministers and his many friends were shocked when they heard of the operation that was necessary, resulting in the amputation of his

right leg. He survived the operation and is doing nicely, according to members of his immediate family.

He resigned as pastor of the church on account of his affliction. No action has been taken by the official board.

Rev. Woodhouse, aside from his pastoral duties, was president of the Grand River Baptist association, an organization of all the Baptist churches in the Grand River valley.

Sept. 24 - 1924
The resignation of Rev. W. T. Woodhouse, pastor of the Baptist church, has been accepted by the official board of the church. Mr. Woodhouse quit the pulpit owing to ill health. A pulpit committee is now at work for a new minister. It consists of E. W. Krainbrink, chairman, H. E. Powell, Ernest Wilcox, Mrs. E. W. Briggs and Mrs. W. C. Steere. Rev. Woodhouse will be able to leave the hospital in a few weeks. It is expected that the family will move to Flint, where one of their sons has employment.
