

# Ex-Ionian Stricken In Pulpit

The Rev. Gorge Woolcock, 69, of Gregory, former pastor of the First Baptist church of Ionia, was stricken Sunday morning with a fatal heart attack in the middle of his sermon at the pulpit of the Gregory Baptist church here he was pastor.

He forced himself to continue the church services and then collapsed just as the service ended. Members of his choir and congregation carried him in a chair to his home across the street from the church where he died at 5:30 p. m.

He was pastor at the Ionia church for nine years, leaving in 1945 for Traverse City. He took up the pastorship of the Gregory church July 21, 1950. Gregory is near Jackson.

## Born In Ontario

The Rev. Woolcock was born November 21, 1881, at Beechville, Ont., and moved to this country with his family May 5, 1893. He was ordained a minister of the Baptist denomination July 14, 1908, at Spring Lake. He was a minister for 45 years. His pastorates were Twining 1906-07, Spring Lake 1907-09, Milan 1909-14, St. Clair 1914-17, Ovid 1917-22, Traverse City 1922-24, Grand Rapids 1924-30, Battle Creek 1930-32, Spring Lake 1932-36, Ionia 1936-45, Traverse City 1945-50, and Gregory July 21, 1950, until the present time.

He married his wife, Ida, March 9, 1909. Surviving him besides his wife are a daughter, Mrs Maureen Alspaugh of Ionia; four grandchildren; one sister, Mrs Romaine Tolles of Eau Clair, Wis.; and a brother, Jake, of St. Clair Shores. A son, Charles, died in 1918 and a daughter, Margaret in 1939 while he was a pastor in Ionia.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10 a. m. Wednesday, September 12, at the Gregory Baptist church and at 2 p. m. at the First Baptist church of Ionia. The body will lie in state at the Ionia church between 1 and 2 p. m. Interment will be in Spring Lake cemetery. Arrangements are being made by the Myers funeral home.
